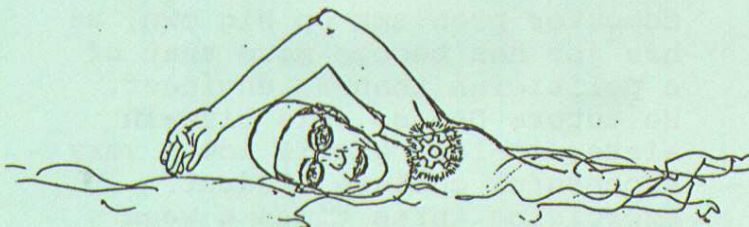


## THE PRUITT FAMILY'S ADVENTURES OF 1990

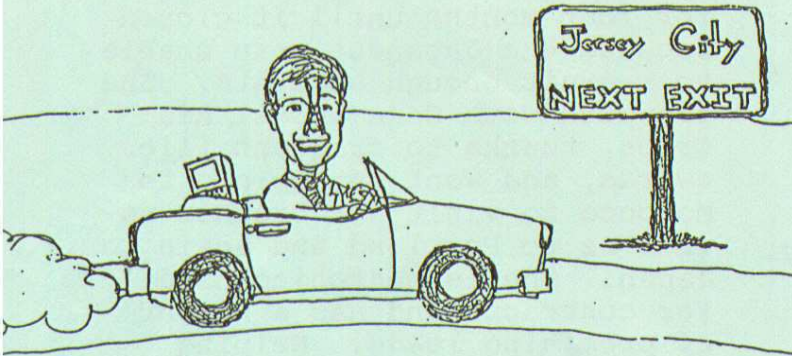

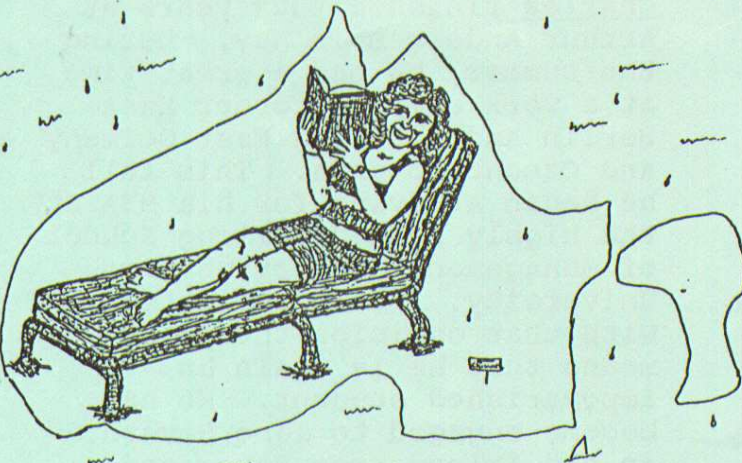
Paul's mirror is overwhelmed by the appearance of his new clothing.
